ROAD SIGNAGES IN DELHI

1952. SHRI SALIM ANSARI:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that road signages in Delhi are not in accordance with Convention on Road Signs and Signals commonly known as Vienna Convention;
- (b) if so, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether Government proposes to adopt Vienna Convention guidelines on designs of signages so that those are clearly visible to motorists; and
- (d) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

(a) & (b): In Delhi, the road signages installed by the Municipal Corporations and PWD are as per the guidelines provided in the relevant code of Indian Road Congress. The road signages are based on IRC-067 – 2012 and are in harmony with protocol on Road Signs and Signals of United Nations Conference on Road and Motor Transport, 1949 and Vienna Convention of Road Signs and Signals, 1968.

(c) & (d): India is a signatory to the Vienna Convention on Road Signs and Signals and road sign prescribed under Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 are mostly in harmony with the same.
