INSTALLING CCTV CAMERAS ON INDO-PAK BORDER

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government has decided to install CCTV cameras on Indo-Pak border in Punjab to check infiltration across the border especially in rainy season; and

(b) if so, the progress made in this regard so far?

(a) & (b): Government of India has decided to deploy technological solutions in the form of integration of Radars, Sensors, Cameras, Communication Networks and Command and Control Solution in various difficult terrains where fencing could not be installed. Initially, it has been decided to launch pilot project in Punjab, Gujarat (Sir Creek), South Bengal, Tripura and Jammu regions. Tender for two patches of 05 to 06 Kms in Jammu region has been floated.
