ASSITANCE TO KARNATAKA UNDER NDRF

400. SHRI IRANNA KADADI:

Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

(a) the total central assistance released to Karnataka from the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) for drought and flood relief in the last three years;

(b) the status of the pending proposals from Karnataka seeking drought and flood relief, especially for Belagavi district;

(c) funds that have been allocated to Karnataka under the 'Modernisation of Police Forces' (MPF) scheme in the last two years;

(d) specific support that has been provided to upgrade the police infrastructure in Belagavi district; and

(e) the status of the establishment of new Integrated Check Posts (ICPs) or border outposts in Karnataka?

(a) & (b): As per National policy on Disaster Management, the primary responsibility for disaster management rests with the State Governments concerned. For supplementing the efforts of the State Government, financial assistance is provided from the existing scheme of State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) and National Disaster

Response Fund (NDRF) in accordance with the established procedure. The allocation in the SDRF of the State is made towards all notified disasters including drought, flood, and it is for the State Government concerned to provide necessary relief to affected people from SDRF already placed at its disposal in accordance with Government of India approved items & norms, in the event of a natural disaster through their established channel of district administrative machineries in accordance with the magnitude of the ground situation.

The year-wise allocation and release of funds from SDRF and release of funds from NDRF to State Government of Karnataka during the last 3 years are given as under:

(c) to (e): CoBRA School of Jungle Warfare & Tactics Centre (CSJWT) of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and 44th Battalion of the Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) are situated in Belagavi District. The Central Government has sanctioned funds to upgrade the infrastructure of these two establishments from time-to-time.

No projects have been sanctioned in the name of Belagavi district, under Assistance to States & UT for Modernization of Police (ASUMP) scheme. However, items approved for Karnataka may be utilized for any district including Belagavi as decided by the State. The year-wise allocated and released fund to Karnataka under the ASUMP scheme in the last two years are given as under:
