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**RELIEF AND REHABILITATION OF THE PERSONS DISPLACED DUE TO  
DISRUPTION OF PUBLIC ORDER IN NORTH EAST STATES**

Though in terms of Entries 1 and 2 of List II – ‘State List’ – in the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India, ‘public order’ and ‘police’ are the responsibilities of the States, Article 355 of the Constitutions enjoins the Union to protect every State against external aggression and internal disturbances and to ensure that the Government of every State is carried on in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution. In pursuance of these obligations, the Ministry of Home Affairs continuously monitors the internal security situation and extends support to the States, for maintenance of security, peace and harmony.

2. In view of the prevailing law & order situation due to ethnic strife in Manipur, the Central Government has extended special assistance to the State of Manipur during FY 2023-24 and 2024-25 as below:
