Union Home Minister chairs the review meeting of LWE - affected States

MANDATE

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has multifarious responsibilities, important among them being internal security, border management, Centre-State relations, administration of Union Territories, management of Central Armed Forces, disaster management, VISA and Citizen issues, etc. Though in terms of Entries 1 and 2 of List II – 'State List' – in the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India, 'public order' and 'police' are the responsibilities of States, Article 355 of the Constitution enjoins the Union to protect every State against external aggression and internal disturbance and to ensure that the government of every State is carried on in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution.

In pursuance of these obligations, the Ministry of Home Affairs continuously monitors the internal security situation including the LWE affected areas, Jammu and Kashmir and the North East. It also issues appropriate advisories, shares intelligence inputs, extends manpower and financial support, guidance and expertise to the State Governments for maintenance of security, peace and harmony without encroaching upon the constitutional domain of the States.





INDO-CHINA BORDER

POPULATION AND CITIZEN REGISTER

- The National Population Register updated and seeded with Aadhar number through household enumeration. Digitisation of data of 120.41 crore persons nearing completion
- National Register of Citizen in Assam: Applications of 3.2 crore persons along with 5.94 crore documents received. Field verification and document verification completed. NRC draft to be published in December 2017. Will facilitate in identification of illegal migrants/foreigners



Person of Indian Origin (PIO) Card merged with the Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) Card in January 2015. OCI card serves as a multiple entry lifelong visa for visiting India for any purpose with exemption from registration requirements



- Visa Regime liberalised, simplified and rationalised in December 2016 to facilitate legitimate foreign travelers:
 - Increasing duration of stay on e-visa from 30 days to 60 days. Double entry on e-Tourist and e-Business visas and triple entry on e-Medical visa
 - E-visa facility extended to nationals of 162 countries; entry allowed through 24 designated international airports as well as 5 major Indian seaports
 - Duration of Tourist and Business Visa to normally be 5 years for nationals of more than 160 countries

- Visa on Arrival scheme introduced for Japanese nationals w.e.f. 1.3.2016
- Permanent Residency Status (PRS) scheme introduced in October 2016 for foreign investors above certain threshold. Validity 10 years, with multiple entry facility. Also granted to the spouse/ dependents of the eligible foreign investor
- Visas opened to Indian assylees abroad and their children/ grandchildren
- 5-year multiple entry tourist visa to Mukthijodhas of Bangladesh

Facilities extended to minority communities of Bangladesh, Pakistan and Afghanistan:

- Entry and stay of religiously persecuted Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains, Parsis and Christians of above countries (who entered India till 31.12.2014) legalised
- Benefits such as opening of NRO Bank account, purchase of small dwelling unit, taking up self employment/ business, free movement within the State/ UT, issuance of PAN card/ Aadhaar Card/ Driving License etc. extended to LTV holders of such minority communities in August 2016
- District Collectors of 16 Districts in 7 States/ State Governments concerned delegated powers to grant citizenship to such persons for a period of 2 years
- Application and processing fee for grant of citizenship to such persons reduced considerably in December 2016
- Amendments proposed in the Citizenship Act to enable such minority communities to acquire citizenship. Bill under consideration of the Joint Committee of Parliament


